Proclamation

WHEREAS, the month of May was chosen as Asian American & Pacific Islander Heritage Month to commemorate the immigration of the first Japanese citizen, Nakahama Manjiro, to the United States on May 7, 1843, but also the anniversary of the May 10, 1869 completion of the first Transcontinental Railroad, built with the back-breaking labor of nearly 20,000 Chinese immigrants; and

WHEREAS, during World War II Father Edward Flanagan and Boys Town provided assistance to over two hundred Japanese Americans who had been placed into internment camps by the United States government. Father Flanagan provided a number of Japanese Americans a place to live and work without discrimination or harassment; and

WHEREAS, the Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) community members serve as artists, business owners, educators, health care professionals, lawyers and judges, clergy members, first responders and military personnel; and

WHEREAS, we celebrate the achievements and contributions of Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders that enrich our history, society and culture, we must also acknowledge a darker aspect of the AAPI experience in America - structural discrimination, prejudice and injustice; and

WHEREAS, Asian American and Pacific Islanders have distinguished themselves as leading researchers in science, medicine, and technology; innovative farmers and ranchers; distinguished lawyers, judges and government leaders; in the arts, literature, and sports; and as war heroes who have been fierce defenders of our country; and

WHEREAS, through the Asian American and Pacific Islanders' love of family, community, and hard work, they have helped to uphold the founding principles of our commonwealth for generations; and

WHEREAS, Asian American and Pacific Islanders strengthen our economy and our communities through their dedication and ingenuity, inspiring the next generation of American innovation by example; and


